February! It's a small month with some big stuff happening. Our Confirmation group, which started way back in February 2020, is on the home-stretch now. On Transfiguration Sunday, Feb. 14, at our 10:30 a.m. worship service, those students who are ready will publicly confirm their faith in God and take responsibility for their baptismal vows and membership at Memorial UMC. Thanks so much to the parents, grandparents, and adult mentors who have been working with our students, and to the entire congregation for all you have invested in the faith journey of these youth. And, thanks to you students who are taking this next step.

For Confirmation on Feb. 14, we plan to offer in-person worship. We will be livestreaming the 10:30 a.m. service. We will continue to offer a pre-recorded worship experience on-line as well. Of course we're expecting anyone who attends in-person to plan to wear a face covering, stay at least six-feet away from anyone not in their household, and observe the other common guidelines to minimize spreading disease. We also expect anyone who has a positive COVID diagnosis, has been in contact with anyone with COVID, or is otherwise experiencing symptoms of contagious disease to stay home. After a year of this, I'm trusting we're all familiar with and willing to take responsibility for interacting with each other for the health and wellbeing of everyone.

Just as we begin to gather again for in-person worship, we will be entering the season of Lent, a time of contemplating our mortality. "Remember you are dust, and to dust you shall return," is often said on Ash Wednesday as we have ashes smudged on our foreheads. For many of us, it may feel as though we've had an entire year of Lent, of contemplating our mortality while grieving the loss of loved ones and our disconnection from so much of what we'd come to view as "normal" life. Yet the 40-days of Lent are also a time of doubling down on our faith in a God who gives us abundant and eternal life in Jesus Christ, who empowers us with Holy Spirit to be fully alive in the here and now.

Lent is a season of honestly examining our lives, acknowledging where we've gotten off course or caused injury, seeking forgiveness and reconciliation with God and one another, and taking time to study God's word, pray, practice fasting and other forms of self-denial that help us move out of the spotlight, giving more room for Christ to shine through our lives. We'll start our Lenten journey on Ash Wednesday, Feb. 17, with a Blessing of Ashes at 11:30 a.m. and an open sanctuary until 2 p.m. for anyone who would like to stop by and receive ashes. We'll also have a brief Ash Wednesday worship service at 7 p.m. in-person, in the sanctuary. I do hope you will all embrace the opportunity and challenge of Lent to draw near to God and to each other, with a humble heart ready to be renewed by God's grace.

Covid-19 Scams

Here's what to know:

- You can't pay to put your name on a vaccine list.
- You can't pay to get early access to a vaccine.
- Don't share your personal or financial information if someone calls, texts, or emails you promising access to the vaccine for a fee.

If you come across a COVID-19 vaccine scam, **report it to the Federal Trade Commission** or call **1-800-MEDICARE**. And check out **CDC.gov** for trustworthy information on the COVID-19 vaccine.
