Welcome to “Ordinary Time,” that long liturgical season after Pentecost stretching on through summer and autumn until Advent. *Ask the UMC*, a ministry of United Methodist Communications, says, “The purpose of this season is to support new disciples and the whole congregation in living out the gifts and callings discerned during the Easter Season and commissioned on the Day of Pentecost.” Appropriately enough, the liturgical color for this season is green, the color of growth and abundant life.

Yet for many of us, this continues to be a season of uncertainty. Making plans for worship and ministry, like so many other aspects of our lives, challenges us to wonder will what we are planning be safe and healthy? Will it be allowed? Will we have to figure out new ways to do it, learn new techniques, use new tools? Will the situation change between now and when what we are planning is set to happen? Would it be better to wait or to forge ahead? Working with our Leadership, Committees, and Health Response Task Force; and trusting in God’s presence, guidance, and timing in our planning, we are moving forward.

We are moving forward in forming our faith through worship, exploring putting four spiritual practices drawn from *Active Faith*, a book by Wesleyan historian and theologian, Paul W. Chilcote (copyright 2019 by Abingdon Press). I invite you to order a copy for yourself, hoping we’ll find ways to read and discuss it together, beyond our engagement with the book in our Sunday worship.

We are moving forward with live-streaming worship from the sanctuary on Sunday, June 7 at 10:30 a.m. We’ll have a few folks here to help with music and tech support, and to walk through what worship will be like with social distancing, face masks, cleaning and disinfecting, and what all it takes to be together, as safely as possible, in this space. This will give you an opportunity, after watching, to make informed decisions as to whether you will continue to worship from home or choose to attend in person in the coming weeks.

We are moving forward, embracing new ways to connect with one another in caring ministries and mission outreach, supported by your generous giving of your time, talents, and treasure. Look for those stories throughout this newsletter. In this season of uncertainty, as we long for what seems ordinary, may we continue to grow together into the extraordinary and abundant life to which God calls us through Jesus Christ.
