Here at Memorial United Methodist Church we say it this way: “We live to proclaim the love of Jesus Christ.” That’s why we are here, why we exist as a church. It’s what we do and how we live, guided and powered by God’s grace. The Book of Discipline goes on to say: “Christian ministry is the expression of the mind and mission of Christ by a community of Christians that demonstrates a common life of gratitude and devotion, witness and service, celebration and discipleship. All Christians are called through their baptism to this ministry of servanthood in the world to the glory of God and for human fulfillment.” As Christians, this is who we are called by Jesus Christ to be. At our best, this is who we actually are.

I’ll confess, in some ways, this has been a tough year for us to be at our best. Yet, in other ways, the challenge to focus on the “essentials” in some innovative ways is bringing out the best in many of you. You’ve found creative ways to connect, to care for each other and for those most in need in our community. We’ve stayed ahead of the curve with our finances, continuing to meet our operational expenses, pay our denominational ministry shares, and give generously to local and world-wide missions. And we’ve kept on worshipping, sometimes on-line, sometimes in-person, sometimes outside, and always with a willing spirit of grace and devotion. I am so grateful to in ministry with this congregation as we work together to offer our best and to bring out the best in each other.

With the rising spread of COVID-19 in our area in July, we switched again to on-line worship for August, no longer gathering for worship inside our building. We also continue to mail resources to those without internet access. Our Health Response Task Force and I are considering remaining with this form of on-line worship for the rest of this year. After five months of hoping for some quick-fix, it seems that a return to pre-pandemic normal is not a realistic expectation for any time soon.

Shifting from one format to another, one set of technological tools to another, one venue to another, from week to week, often with a few days’ notice, draws our attention time away from other essential ministries. Rather than requiring week-to-week discussions and decisions, I would prefer continuity in our worship over the next few months. This will allow for longer-range planning and free up time and energy for discovering the best ways to engage with one another in witness, service, spiritual formation, discipleship and ministry—in being the church of Jesus Christ in our current circumstances. Our goal is “to live to proclaim the love of Jesus Christ,” in all its fullness. I trust, with God’s grace and our participation, it will be so.

## Charge Conference Tuesday, October 20

Usually we have a **Church** Conference where we encourage all Church members to attend. However, in the interest of limiting crowd size, the District Superintendent is calling instead a **Charge** Conference at 7:30, which involves the District Superintendent, Pastor, Church Council members, and any retired UM clergy at Memorial UMC. The Charge Conference will cover just required agenda items: pastoral compensation, membership report, election of leadership, and recommendation of candidates for ministry. The plan is to meet in-person but, should a ZOOM meeting be necessary, that will be easier with a smaller group of people.

## Michigan Virtual Annual Conference

Michigan United Methodists, led by Bishop David Bard, met through Zoom technology, July 26-27, with clergy session July 28. The annual gathering of nearly 1,500 clergy and laity worshipped together and conducted the required business. Lay members from Memorial UMC included Susan Lagina and Laurie de la Garza. Ted Brainard participated as a member of the Conference Board of Ordained Ministry.

Through Memorial's mission giving, our Mission Committee designated \$1,000 to the annual conference offering in support of Haitian Artisans for Peace's "Start Right" program for maternal and newborn health in Haiti (45%), Bishop Judith Craig Children's Village in Liberia (45%), and Michigan Disaster Response and Recovery (10%).

Pastor Cathy joined the virtual 5K this year. We raised \$300, so she ran 2 more miles for the \$200 above our first \$100, a total of 5.1 rainy miles on July 26. Her pace 12 miles/minute pace was one mile per minute slower than her goal, so she contributed another \$10. As of July 27, over 200 runners, walkers and bicyclists had participated in the virtual event, raising \$7,500 so far.

**Life Line Screening** will be doing preventive health screenings here at Memorial Church on Saturday, December 5. Ultrasound screenings to identify risk factors for Cardiovascular disease include **Carotid Artery** (plaque buildup-a leading cause of stroke), **Abdominal Aortic Aneurysm** (an enlargement or weak area in the main blood vessel that carries blood from the heart to the rest of the body), **Peripheral Arterial Disease** (hardening of the arteries in the legs), a **Heart Rhythm Screening** (an EKG to detect Atrial Fibrillation-irregular heartbeat) and an **Osteoporosis Risk Assessment** for men and women.
