Confirming the Baptismal Covenant [UMH 33]

Pastor: Friends, family, siblings in Christ: we celebrate baptism as an outward and visible sign of the grace we share in Jesus Christ. Through the Sacrament of Baptism, we are initiated into the Christian community of faith. We acknowledge God's gracious acts of salvation, and we are given new birth through water and the Spirit. All of this is God's gift, offered to us without price. It is our practice in the United Methodist Church for parents to bring their children to be baptized, to make vows on behalf of those children in covenant with God and the church. Then, when each baptized person is ready, they publicly confirm those vows, taking responsibility for their own faith journey, for their relationship to God, and for their membership in a particular church congregation. Confirmation is also an opportunity for the church congregation to affirm their love and acceptance of those being confirmed, to pledge their ongoing support, and to reaffirm their own faith and commitment.

Lay Leader: Through confirmation, and through the reaffirmation of our faith, we renew the covenant declared at our baptism, acknowledge what God is doing for us, and affirm our commitment to Christ's holy Church. On this Transfiguration Sunday, February 14, 2021, I present the following persons for confirmation:

Confirmands come forward.

Pastor: Since the earliest times, the vows of Christian baptism have consisted first of the renunciation of all that is evil and then the profession of faith and loyalty to Christ. Today our candidates for confirmation will publicly profess for themselves the solemn vows that were made at their baptism. So, on behalf of the whole Church, I now ask those to be confirmed:

Do you renounce the spiritual forces of wickedness, reject the evil powers of this world, and repent of your sins?

I do

Do you accept the freedom and power God gives you to resist evil, injustice, and oppression in whatever forms they present themselves?

I do

Do you confess Jesus Christ as your Savior, put your whole trust in his grace, and promise to serve him as your Lord, in union with the Church which Christ has opened to people of all ages, nations, and races?

I do

According to the grace given to you, will you remain faithful members of Christ's holy Church and serve as Christ's representatives in the world?

I will

Lay Leader: Congregation, do you, as Christ's body, the Church, reaffirm both your rejection of sin and your commitment to Christ?

We do

Will you nurture one another in Christian faith and life and include these persons now before you in your care?

With God's help we will proclaim the good news and live according to the example of Christ. We will surround these persons with a community of love and forgiveness that they may grow in their trust of God, and be found faithful in their service to others. We will pray for them, that they may be true disciples who walk in the way that leads to life.

Apostles' Creed (UMH 882)

Prayer of Thanksgiving Over the Water (UMH 36)

Pastor: *Let us pray* – Eternal God: When nothing existed but chaos, you swept across the dark waters and brought forth light.

In the days of Noah you saved those on the ark through water. After the flood you set in the clouds a rainbow.

When you saw your people as slaves in Egypt, you led them to freedom through the sea. Their children you brought through the Jordan to the land which you promised.

Congregation: Sing to the Lord, all the earth. Tell of God's mercy each day.

Lay Leader: In the fullness of time you sent Jesus, nurtured in the water of a womb. He was baptized by John and anointed by your Spirit.

He called his disciples to share in the baptism of his death and resurrection and to make disciples of all nations.

Congregation: Declare his works to the nations, his glory among all the people.

Pastor: Pour out your Holy Spirit, to bless this gift of water and those who receive it, to wash away their sin and clothe them in righteousness throughout their lives, that, dying and being raised with Christ, they may share in his final victory.

Congregation: All praise to you, Eternal God, through your Son Jesus Christ, who with you and the Holy Spirit lives and reigns for ever. Amen.

Confirmation of Faith (UMH37) for each confirmand

Lay Leader: *Name*, please step to the baptismal font. Confirm your baptism and be thankful (*confirmand touches water, traces cross on self*).

Pastor: *Name (pastor and lay leader place hands on confirmand)*, the Holy Spirit work within you, that having been born through water and the Spirit, you may live as a faithful disciple of Jesus Christ.

Congregation: Amen. (*Lay Leader: Present confirmand with certificate*)

Reception into Memorial United Methodist Church (UMH 38)

Pastor: As members of Christ's universal church, will you be loyal to the United Methodist Church, and do all in your power to strengthen its ministries?

Confirmands: We will.

Lay Leader: As members of this congregation, will you faithfully participate in its ministries by your prayers, your presence, your gifts, your service, and your witness?

Confirmands: We will.

At this time, I also present Dylan and Devin Messina who have transferred to this congregation having been already confirmed at Grace UMC in Houghton, Michigan.

Pastor: Members of the household of God, I commend these persons to your love and care. Do all in your power to increase their faith, confirm their hope, and perfect them in love.

We give thanks for all that God has already given you and we welcome you in Christian love. As members together with you in the body of Christ and in this congregation of the United Methodist Church, we renew our covenant faithfully to participate in the ministries of the church by our prayers, our presence, our gifts, our service, and our witness, that in everything God may be glorified through Jesus Christ.

The God of all grace, who has called us to eternal glory in Christ, establish you and strengthen you by the power of the Holy Spirit, that you may live in grace and peace.
