We live to proclaim the love of Jesus Christ! You'll hear me say that a lot. It's what we at Memorial Church say our purpose is. This December newsletter is filled with stories telling how we've done that this year, through the generous giving of your time, treasures, and talents. Now, as we enter the season of Advent, on our way to Christmas, I'm inviting us all to "Come and See the Saviour." Experience the love of God, which dwells among us in Jesus, born as a baby long ago, still living in and through us, making a difference in our lives today.

We're singing a worship song for Advent called, "Come and See the Saviour," written by Marcus Pagnam, who served as a worship leader at St. John Harborne Church until last year and is now studying to be a vicar in the Church of England. He's a young guy with a heart for worship. The lyrics of his song, "Come and See the Saviour," offer us heaven's invitation to see the image of our maker, God, lying in a manger. Each Sunday, we'll share a fresh glimpse of who God is and who Jesus comes to be: 1) hope of all creation, 2) healing for the nations, 3) mercy for the stranger, and 4) promise of the ages. On Christmas Eve we'll see how God wraps it all up for us in the perfect gift from heaven. Of course we will also hear music from our Glory Ringers handbell choir, MUMC Band, and Praise Team, including some favorite Christmas Carols from week to week.

Along with joining us in worship, I'm encouraging each of you to keep a watchful eye for where you see God at work in your lives and our world each day. Be on the lookout for the hope, peace, joy, and love that God offers to us through Jesus. Notice how Emmanuel (which means God with us) shows up in the people you meet this month. It's so much easier for us all to proclaim the love of Jesus Christ when we're hearing God's Spirit speaking that love to us, when we're seeing Jesus alive in the lives of others, and when we're feeling God's amazing grace deep in our hearts. Take time to soak up that love that is from God wherever you find it, because it's hard to share, let alone proclaim, what we aren't experiencing ourselves. So this Advent and Christmas, "Come and See the Saviour," for yourself in worship and in everything else you're doing as we prepare to celebrate God's perfect gift from heaven, our savior Jesus Christ. Singers will also visit and sing for some of the area's shut-ins.

Everyone is welcome to join the event. After caroling, Christmas cookies, hot chocolate and coffee will be served back at Memorial United Methodist Church.

What Got Pledged and Where Does it Go?

As of Nov. 22, we've received 34 pledges of financial giving in 2022:

General Fund: \$90,232
Building Fund: \$5,560
Missions Fund: \$2,720
Heifer Project: \$90
Other: \$1,700

The **General Fund** is what we use for day-to-day operations—things like salaries, utilities, insurance, and programming costs, along with paying our ministry shares, to help make it possible for our Northern Skies District, Camp Michigamme, Michigan Conference, and worldwide United Methodist denomination to operate as part of our connectional system of ministry and mission.

Typically, it requires about \$200,000 annually to keep Memorial UMC operating, so we're nearly halfway there in pledged giving for 2022. We depend on those who give regularly without making a pledge to make up the difference, which has been a growing number of you over the past few years. Some of our fundraising events and holiday offerings also add to our General Fund.

The **Building Fund** is what we're saving for the big-ticket expenses that come with owning and operating our remarkable facilities—like that roof we may need someday, or a new boiler, or ... well, you get the idea.

The **Missions Fund** is money that's given without being designated for a specific mission or special Sunday offering. Our Mission Committee allocates this money when emergency needs come up, like when the United Methodist Committee on Relief is responding to a disaster, or when Justice for Our Neighbors is inundated with a surge in refugees, like those recently evacuated from Afghanistan. It has also let us take advantage of time-sensitive matching grants, like when Heifer Project offered a 3 to 1 match or when God's Country Cooperative Parish had a matching challenge to raise money for heating the Dunlap Ministry Center.

Whether you pledge or not, we are grateful to everyone who has faithfully supported the

ministry and mission of Memorial UMC this past year and look forward to all that your generous giving and God's grace will make possible in the year ahead. Thanksgiving-Advent-Christmas Offering

We will be dividing any offerings marked for Thanksgiving, Advent or Christmas with 75% going to our General Fund and 25% going to the Delta County "Walk for Warmth" campaign, which helps our neighbors who are struggling to keep their homes heated.

Dollar-to-Dollar Match for Heat in the Dunlap Ministry Center

In 2017 God's Country Cooperative Parish purchased the former Pentland School in Newberry. Much work has happened to make the building usable including asbestos removal, lots of cleaning, installing running water, new windows, beds for work group dorms, showers, bathrooms, painting, new flooring, and much more. Those of us who visited GCCP got a first-hand look at how well the building renovation has come along. GCCP uses this building to house Volunteer-In-Mission work groups who do home repair throughout the area served by GCCP. They also house their "Church Mouse" free store that offers clothing, furniture, and other household goods. However, the building has no heat, so all of this ministry has to stop or relocate for the winter months. The good news is a donor has offered a dollar-to-dollar match up to half of the \$35,000 cost to heat the building. So, GCCP is working to raise \$17,000. Memorial's Mission Committee recently sent \$1,000 from our Mission Fund. If you would like to make an additional contribution, please mark your check or envelope GCCP Heat and we'll send it along. We're hoping to be one of those volunteer work crews staying in the Dunlap Ministry Center next year, so keep watch for details on that soon.

Pasty Sale Results and THANKS!

Another wonderful year and we made 636 pasties to give us a total profit of \$2,330! This after having the top convection oven not working, so all of you stepped up and we got through it.

Once again, I want to thank every one of you fantastic, wonderful workers for your time and your talents! Let us mention Jan Watson as our caller without whom this would never happen. She is an Angel! Then there are my main workers that stand on their feet for endless hours for 2 whole days, and I appreciate every one of you more than you can know! Finally, the fun begins when the rest of you “2-hour shift workers” show up to “play in the dough”, toss around some veggies or scoop up meat mixtures! The chatter and laughter is contagious, and we wish all of the rest of our Church Family could join in. Many of you put in extra hours, and for that we thank you again! You are an AWESOME Church Family, and I am so proud to be a member of such a great group of people! The compliments I hear from the people that bring pasties home are once again that these are *THE BEST PASTIES they have ever had!*

Moment in Missions

The Missions Committee would like to share the celebrations of our congregation's giving of time, talent, and offerings for November.

- World Day Communion offering for scholarships update from October: \$210
- Golden Cross offering for health and welfare ministries update from October: \$420
- Justice for Our Neighbors: \$2000 from the undesignated Mission fund to provide urgently needed legal assistance to immigrants and Afghan refugees in Michigan.
- God's Country Cooperative Parish: \$1000 from the undesignated Mission fund to help put heat in the Dunlap Ministry Center in Newberry (GCCP has a matching grant for this).
- Hope at the Inn was successfully staffed and meals prepared for the four guests that stayed at our church November 7-14. A special thank you to the youth group for taking care of the laundry and to our HATI Coordinator Susan Laguna.
- Mission volunteers prepared and boxed meals for 40 Bay College students on November 8.
- November Food Drive collected non-perishable goods and household items for the Salvation Army and St. Vincent de Paul food pantries to distribute.
- Venison Project is well underway thanks to promotional work by Kole Desotelle and Teresa Myers and the generosity of local processors. Check the January newsletter to see how many pounds of venison were split between the food pantries in Gladstone and Escanaba.
- Flannel Shirt Drive collected boxes and boxes of flannel shirts for God's Country Cooperative Parish to distribute.

- Offerings designated for Thanksgiving, Advent, or Christmas will be split between our General fund (75%) and Walk for Warmth (25%) that helps our neighbors keep their homes heated.
- Dec. 19: Noisy Offering supports Heifer International. Let's get one more cow this year!
- Elmer's Community Cares Program: Donate points to MUMC and we can use it towards getting a \$100 gift card. This can be used to help offset grocery costs for projects like Bay Area Campus Ministry meals and Hope at the Inn meals. We currently have 66,824 points.

Hands-On Mission Trips

One of MUMC's five goals for 2022 in proclaiming the love of Jesus Christ is to engage in mission outreach through **hands-on opportunities** to serve. The Mission committee is looking at two trips in 2022 in the UP. One is to work at God's Country Cooperative Parish. The other is to visit the 2021 Northern District Skies Mission of the Year-- Mohawk-Ahmeek UMC. We supported this church by raising \$1,778 and they were very thankful for this assistance to help with repairs on their church. As part of this trip, we may visit other ministries or do hands-on work in the Keweenaw area. What we do will depend on how many sign up and the talents you bring to serve others in need. Know who's committed to going and what we can do will also help us select the best week to work at GCCP.
