“There is a time for everything, and a season for every activity under the heavens” —Ecclesiastes 3:1 (NIV)

The Hebrew Bible wisdom writer who authored the Book of Ecclesiastes struggled to find a sense of meaning or purpose in life. While chapter three of the book contains the passage made famous by Pete Seeger and a host of other folk musicians from the 1960s—*to everything (turn, turn, turn)/there is a season (turn, turn, turn)/and a time to every purpose, under heaven*—much of the writing builds from the phrase “all is vanity!” We’re living through a time now that may have that feeling about it. It can seem that no matter what we do, what we try to plan or accomplish, what we work toward, it just doesn’t turn out the way we’d hoped. Or, even if it does, it still leaves us feeling ... *meh*.

Maybe that’s just the end of January in northern Michigan. Maybe it’s entering what will soon be year three of life with covid. Maybe it’s the political climate, the economic climate, or just the whole climate mess that we’d rather not deal with. Whatever it is, it can have an energy-sapping effect on us. Even in the life of the Church, we’re in a sort of in-between season, Christmas and Epiphany are over and Easter is an especially long way off this year. Lent doesn’t even start until the beginning of March! So we have February to face first, that shortest month that can seem to muddle along forever.

To help get through this season together, in worship we’re starting with a celebration of Holy Communion, an experience of God’s grace and the presence of Jesus with us, snuggled under the hovering warmth of the Holy Spirit. We’ll consider how it is Jesus has taught us to stay together, overcoming the conflicts that would let the cold winds of division pull us apart. We’ll wonder about this God we call King, in a time when few, if any, of us have any experience of living under the rule of a monarchy. And we’ll finish up February with a rip-roaring Mardi Gras celebration before we head into the season of Lent. We also have opportunities to study together, learning how to share our faith through an evangelism class on Tuesday evenings and learning more about our United Methodist denomination’s views of human sexuality on Sunday mornings and Wednesday evenings. And all of our committees are up and running, making ministry and missions happen all month long. I do hope you’ll take time to read through this entire newsletter and see where God may be nudging you to get engaged.

It’s our choice to make. We can tap into the deep roots of our faith, our worship, our connection to each other and to God that give our lives the meaning we may be missing. Or, we can muddle along lamenting the lack of purpose and the overload of activities that never seem to fill the void. In this season of so much uncertainty, may we all be certain in the grace of God, the love of Jesus, and the life-giving power of the Holy Spirit!

Evangelism for Non-Evangelists

Starts Tuesday, Feb. 8, 7-8:30 p.m.

One of our 2022 Memorial Church goals is learning and practicing the skills we need to share our faith with others. You can participate along with Pastor Cathy in Garrett-Evangelical Theological Seminary's six-week webinar for churches Feb. 8 – March 15, live Tuesdays 7-8:30 p.m. at church in the youth room. This evangelism course for non-evangelists will introduce us to a practice that helps you grow in your faith at the same time you develop the skills to share your faith with others. At the end of this course, we will be able to:

- Explain what you have authentically experienced as the goodness of God in your life
- Reflect on how you participate in the Christian Tradition
- Listen to your context so you know what matters most to those who are part of it
- Develop creative practices for sharing your faith
- Assess the evangelistic effectiveness of congregational ministries

The textbook for the course is: *Evangelism for Non-Evangelists: Sharing the Gospel Authentically* by Rev. Dr. Mark R. Teasdale, available on Amazon or from InterVarsity Press.

Living Faithfully: Human Sexuality and The United Methodist Church

In February, Pastor Cathy will be leading a four-week study using the book *Living Faithfully: Human Sexuality and The United Methodist Church* published in 2019 as a resource for United Methodist congregations. You can join on Sundays at 9:30 a.m. Feb. 6, 13, 20, and 27 or on Wednesdays at 7 p.m. Feb. 2, 9, 16, and 23.

There is deep disagreement about what The United Methodist Church should teach and practice concerning homosexuality, same-gender marriage, and ordination of LGBTQ persons. We have been trying to resolve this for many years. A General Conference, postponed due to Covid in 2020, is scheduled for the end of August this year, although as an international gathering of thousands, it may need to be postponed yet again as the global pandemic persists. Meanwhile, United Methodists continue to struggle with their churches, families, and even within their own individual selves. This study is meant to help us have honest, well-informed, and grace-filled conversations with one another about how to live faithfully together as we discern where God is leading.

Seven Passages Film

Along with the “Living Faithfully” study, Pastor Cathy is recommending we view the film “Seven Passages: The Stories of Gay Christians” It will be shown at church on Ash Wednesday, Mar. 2, at 7:30 p.m., (runs approx. 90 minutes) after the 7 p.m. Ash Wednesday worship service. Created as a stage play in 2007 by a team of actors and theatre artists led by then Calvin College drama professor Stephanie Sandberg, the show is based on interviews with more than 100 West Michigan residents about what life is like for them as gay Christians. The title refers to the seven biblical passages related to homosexuality. Dialogue includes only the biblical quotes and actual scripts from Sandberg’s interviews. Pastor Cathy will lead a discussion of the film on Sunday, March 6, at 9:30 a.m. for anyone who has seen the film.

Finance Committee

Our congregation at Memorial is known for the “church that can get things done.” We are strong in Missions and have received recognition as a “Spotlight Church,” now called an “EngageMI congregation.” We are community-minded, and our beautiful facility is shared for many different events. Our church has strong leadership and people who really find it in their hearts to be great stewards of their resources.

This New Year, 2022, pledges are lower than the past, and because of COVID many people have chosen not to attend church in person. The ability of people to gather in groups is reduced; fundraisers are at a minimum, and with COVID starting its third year, many people are not connected to each other.

Cash flow, especially during the first quarter and late in the summer months is a challenge. Everyone who supports Memorial can help by doing any of the following suggestions. Give on a regular basis. We have several ways to give: in person, mailed in checks, credit card used on the webpage or the square reader at church. If you need assistance to use the website or square reader, please contact Virginia or ask for help in the office. If you are able, please add a little more to your offering to help with the expenses of the church. Do you want to pay for a month of snow plowing? This past month’s bill was \$1,560. How about one month of Ministry Shares? That would be \$2,002. You can celebrate your special person or event with a donation to the Gift Box. Maybe your committee or group of people from within the church would like to see a fundraiser happen – please share those ideas at a Church Council meeting, get the approval needed, and get the event scheduled on the church calendar. It is always a good thing to get new, fresh ideas.

This year will be a challenge, but you and every person involved in Memorial can be assured the Finance Committee will be the best stewards of your monies. The Finance Committee will do its best to help committees find the financial resources needed to accomplish their tasks. It is important that each committee is represented at our monthly Finance meeting held on the second Tuesday of each month at 6:30, either by the chairperson or a person designated by the committee. Having a committee’s presence at the meeting keeps the communications flowing not only with the Finance Committee but also with other committee chairs/members. Everyone can stay informed on what is happening in the life of Memorial’s finances.

If you have any questions or concerns, please feel free to contact any member of the Finance Committee at any time. Any suggestions are always welcomed.

Celebrations!

- Thank you notes were received from MDS Community Action and St. Vincent de Paul for the \$643.13 and \$643.12 respectively sent for their heating assistance fund. This money was given from the Thanksgiving/Advent/Christmas offering.
- The Venison project was a huge success. Special thank you to Teresa Myers and Cole Desotelle for serving as the coordinators this year. One hundred ten pounds of venison was given to Gladstone St. Vincent; two hundred seventy pounds to Escanaba St. Vincent; one hundred sixteen pounds to Seventh Day Adventist; and the Salvation Army is waiting for their delivery due to a processing supply shortage being experienced by the meat processor.
- The Human Relations Day offering: \$51 will be split between the UM Community Development Program, the UM Voluntary Services Program, and the Youth Offender Rehabilitation Program.
