Jesus asked his disciples, “And what about you? Who do you say that I am?” Peter answered, “You are the Christ.” — Mark 8:29 (CEB)

And what about you? Who do you say that Jesus is? That’s a question we’ve been wrestling with in the *Evangelism for Non-Evangelists* class. Perhaps less directly, we’ve struggled with that same question in our *Living Faithfully: Human Sexuality and the United Methodist Church* study. Who do we say that Jesus is? What is your experience of Jesus in your life? How do we connect that individual experience to our community of faith? To the larger story of the Christian tradition? To the foundational source we have of revelation through the Gospels and the whole of the Bible?

These are big questions that we’ve been considering in the little month of February. And we are living through times that require big answers of our shared faith in Jesus Christ. Some of us are living through intense personal struggles related to our health, to the loss of loved ones, to financial or family concerns. All of us are living through ongoing denominational, national, and global strife. The number of folks outside the Christian faith or barely connected to it anymore, those who reject it out of hand as unnecessary or shun it as unhelpful and unhealthy are growing. The beliefs and practices, laws and lessons to which the label “Christian” is attached is alarming to many of us. So, who do we say that Jesus is?

I say that Jesus, revealed to us by God’s Holy Spirit through a careful and prayerful study of the Bible, together as a community of faith, is our way through the big questions, difficult struggles, and alarming situations we face. It has also been my experience that Jesus is the one who will call us to dig deeper and go farther than we ever thought we could, to grow and to change under the influence of his redeeming love and sanctifying grace. Even Peter had to rethink what it meant that Jesus was the “Christ.” Even Peter struggled, failed, and tried again when it really mattered. I pray each of you will choose to join us on this journey, to move beyond how we wish life used to be, past knee-jerk reactions and too-tightly wrapped answers that ask nothing of us, to discover together the rich resources, rooted deeply in God’s love and grace, that we have in our shared identity as Christians, as those who follow Jesus the Christ.

To help us along, for the season of Lent, we’re shaping our worship around the question, “Who do you say that I am?” Each week we’ll explore an image of who Jesus is in our lives: Friend, Teacher, Savior, Lord, Bread of Life, the Way, and the Risen Presence among us on Easter. I’ve been reading the book *Freeing Jesus* by Diana Butler Bass and have her to thank for this framework. We’re also using a praise song, “Who Is This?” by Joel Payne from resoundworship.org to call us to worship through the season of Lent, with the chorus: *This is our God, working wonders and miracles, this is the Saviour, the Son who was slain and rose again in the greatest of miracles, and by this miracle we are saved!* Jesus is answer that is big enough, with a grace that is necessary and a love that is more than sufficient for us to become who God created us to be! Thanks be to God.

Seven Passages Film

Created as a stage play in 2007 by a team of actors and theatre artists led by then Calvin College drama professor Stephanie Sandberg, the show is based on interviews with more than 100 West Michigan residents about what life is like for them as gay Christians. The title refers to the seven biblical passages related to homosexuality. Dialogue includes only the biblical quotes and actual scripts from Sandberg's interviews. Pastor Cathy will lead a discussion of the film on Sunday, March 6, at 9:15 a.m. for anyone who has seen the film.
