The Death of Moses: Deuteronomy 34: 1-12

34 Then Moses climbed Mount Nebo from the plains of Moab to the top of Pisgah, across from Jericho. There the Lord showed him the whole land—from Gilead to Dan, 2 all of Naphtali, the territory of Ephraim and Manasseh, all the land of Judah as far as the Mediterranean Sea, 3 the Negev and the whole region from the Valley of Jericho, the City of Palms, as far as Zoar. 4 Then the Lord said to him, "This is the land I promised on oath to Abraham, Isaac and Jacob when I said, 'I will give it to your descendants.' I have let you see it with your eyes, but you will not cross over into it."

5 And Moses the servant of the Lord died there in Moab, as the Lord had said. 6 He buried him in Moab, in the valley opposite Beth Peor, but to this day no one knows where his grave is. 7 Moses was a hundred and twenty years old when he died, yet his eyes were not weak nor his strength gone. 8 The Israelites grieved for Moses in the plains of Moab thirty days, until the time of weeping and mourning was over.

9 Now Joshua son of Nun was filled with the spirit of wisdom because Moses had laid his hands on him. So the Israelites listened to him and did what the Lord had commanded Moses.

10 Since then, no prophet has risen in Israel like Moses, whom the Lord knew face to face, 11 who did all those signs and wonders the Lord sent him to do in Egypt—to Pharaoh and to all his officials and to his whole land. 12 For no one has ever shown the mighty power or performed the awesome deeds that Moses did in the sight of all Israel.

I would like to share with you a devotion written by Pastor Juanita Campbell Rasmus about this scripture from Deuteronomy.

I can see now, Moses standing atop Mount Nebo one hundred and twenty years old, still bright-eyed and agile enough to make the climb. What a legacy the great leader standing before the majesty of the promise of God manifests after forty long years of managing a nation. Moses had accepted God's challenge to help God's people understand the spiritual formation needed for God's glory and their good.

As a Pastor I often feel stretched as I try to hear God's word and then implement what I hear, knowing that God is forming me and our congregation for the ultimate: a life with God. I can see Moses standing with a panoramic view of the future home of God's people and hearing that he will not enter into that future. I wonder why he doesn't put up a fight or at least a "could you let this cup pass" because I'm still capable and fit for the job. The scripture records none of that. Moses, the servant of the Lord, dies and is buried in an unmarked spot. Today's scripture eulogizes Moses: "Never since has there arisen a prophet in Israel like Moses, whom the Lord knew face to face. He was unequaled."

Today's passage serves as a strong reminder that I am not being shaped only to face my future, however long or short that might be. I am being formed to face the Lord for all eternity. All my life experiences – my joys and sorrows, my sins and successes—are forming me to live in the presence of divine love forever. We are all being formed to live face to face with God and enjoy God forever.

Being a servant of God is not an easy road to travel. Sometimes the road is smooth, and we glide along. Other times it's filled with potholes and mud. In whatever circumstance, we learn as we go. But, with God by our side we can move forward into the ministry that we are called to. May God travel this road with us as we work together to make disciples for Jesus Christ. Amen.

On May 21 this year, 124 members of Memorial UMC voted on whether or not to disaffiliate from the United Methodist Church. The results were:

> 50 voted to disaffiliate 72 voted to remain UMC 2 abstained.
