"The Vote"

The following is information regarding the purpose for the Church Conference on **May 21**, **2023, following the worship service**. The vote is to approve or disapprove disaffiliation of Memorial United Methodist Church from the Michigan Conference of the United Methodist Church.

What this vote is about: The current *Book of Discipline* (bylaws of the United Methodist Denomination) prohibits self-avowed practicing homosexuals from being ordained pastors and prohibits homosexual marriages from being performed in United Methodist churches. In 2024, the General Conference of the United Methodist denomination (world-wide assembly of representatives) will vote on this. Most people are predicting that the vote will eliminate this wording about homosexuals, thereby allowing homosexuals to be ordained United Methodist pastors and allowing United Methodist pastors to officiate at same-sex marriages if they so choose.

After self-reflection and personal discernment, do you believe that self-avowed practicing homosexuals should not be ordained and that homosexual marriages should not be performed in the church? If so, vote to disaffiliate.

Or after self-reflection and personal discernment, do you believe that these prohibitions should be removed from the Book of Discipline? If so, vote to remain United Methodist.

<u>Only church members</u> are allowed to vote, and they must be *physically present* to vote. Mail-in ballots are not allowed. If you would like to verify your membership status, call the church office or check the membership list on the trapezoid table in front of the display cabinet.
