The Little Children and Jesus

People were also bringing babies to Jesus for him to place his hands on them. When the disciples saw this, they rebuked them. But Jesus called the children to him and said, "Let the little children come to me, and do not hinder them, for the kingdom of God belongs to such as these. Truly I tell you, anyone who will not receive the kingdom of God like a little child will never enter it."

Today as I write this article for the newsletter it is the day after Easter, and I am reflecting on the Easter celebration we had in worship yesterday.

I remember calling the children up to the front of the sanctuary to talk to me. It is always tricky to invite the kids to talk to me. You never know what they may say or do especially on a day when you know they have had a bit of candy. Yet, they are so willing to share all their emotions and energy. I love spending time with them. They bring me such joy. I hope they do the same for you.

Since I have been serving here as your pastor, I have regularly referred to those with a few years of experience as "older children of God." Young children still show wonder in our world.

We can't experience Easter without wonder. But as we grow older wonder is rare. When God touches you, you know it. You can't explain it. You experience it. You feel it. It goes right through you.

In Chichen Soup For the Soul, Dan Millman tells the story of Sachi. When Sachi was four years old her baby brother was born. Little Sachi began to ask her parents to leave her alone with the new baby. They worried that, like most four-year-olds, she might feel jealous and want to hit him or shake him, so they said, "No." Over time though, since she wasn't showing signs of jealousy, they changed their minds and decided to let her have her private conference with her baby brother. Elated, Sachi went into her brother's room and shut the door, but it opened a crack – enough for her curious parents to peek in and listen. They saw her walk quietly up to her baby brother, put her face close to his, and say, "Baby, tell me what God feels like. I'm starting to forget."

I often wonder if we, as older children of God, have we forgotten what God feels like. Yes, we worship God and proclaim Jesus as the only Son of God and we invite the Holy Spirit to draw us closer to God, but what does God feel like?

Is God a god of rules and regulations, ready to judge us, or is God a god of loving kindness who nurtures us and cares deeply for us? What does God *really* feel like? I leave you with that question to ponder and maybe discuss with other children of God when you get together. May God bless you today and every day.
